MISSOUI A AWARDED MONTANA HIGH SCHOOL ASSOCIATION EVENTS

Missoula will host the 2017 State AA Soccer Tournament and the 2018 Class B Combined Boys and Girls State Basketball Tournament

April 21, 2016 — Missoula, MT — Destination Missoula is proud to announce that Missoula has been chosen as the host city for two Montana High School Association (MHSA) events in 2017 and 2018. The brand new facilities at Fort Missoula will host the 2017 State AA Soccer Tournament and the University of Montana Adams Center will host the 2018 Class B Combined Boys and Girls State Basketball Tournament.

"This is a win for our community. Without the support of state high school events, such as State AA Soccer, community dreams such as Fort Missoula would not have been realized," said Shirley Kinsey, Recreation Manager at Missoula Parks & Recreation. "These state high school sporting events not only bring people into our community, but allow us to continue creating state-of-the-art sporting facilities that in turn, the entire community gets to enjoy. Over the past four years, Destination Missoula, the Missoula Tourism Business Improvement District (TBID) along with the Destination Missoula Sports Commission and participating high schools have been pushing hard to bid on and bring state events into our community. So far, Missoula has been successfully awarded approximately 50 percent of the events bid on.
